Pinecone birdfeeders, page 213

Welcome to the Kentucky 4H virtual experience today we're focusing on 4H cloverbuds. My name is Jennifer Tackett and I am an extension specialist for 4H youth development.

Today we're going to our activity focuses on plants and animals and we're going to make a pine cone birdfeeder. The materials that you will need are a large pine cone, peanut butter or Crisco, mixed bird seed, scissors string and wax paper

Take your pine cone and cover it in peanut butter or Crisco. Make sure you roll up your seat sleeves as this can get messy. When the pine cone is covered with peanut butter or Crisco roll it in the bird seed taking care to cover it with as much seed as possible. Next you'll tie string at one end and it's ready to hang outside.

Once you hang it outside watch for birds in your yard. What kinds of birds do you see? what kind of things do they eat? Do animals other than birds come to the bird feeder?
