GENERAL PURPOSE:

The general purpose: To develop an educational program that provides youth opportunities to master technical skills and creative abilities; explore careers in the science, engineering and technology industry; develop leadership abilities and character; build self-confidence; improve public speaking and presentation skills and share knowledge with others 1) Act as a chaperone for the Kentucky 4-H SET Teen Leadership Board; 2) Work with State 4-H staff to advise members on resources in science, engineering and technology. 3) Offer assistance to the State 4-H Staff and other directors regarding programming and education at meetings and to serve as a positive role model and influence to the youth involved in the 4-H program.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Attend all meetings in the advisor/chaperone role.
- Enforce positive behavior and the code of conduct among members of the Kentucky 4-H Science, Engineering & Technology (SET).
- Attend State Fair SET Theme Day, 4-H Summit and Teen Conference and other trainings as needed.

- Serve as chaperone if needed for culminating educational trip at end of year.
- Register for all state conferences and events you attend.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Be a 4-H agent or agent with 4-H Responsibilities or Volunteer in “good standing” in 4-H
- Volunteer Mentors must be at 19 years old or no longer participating as a youth in the 4-H program.
- Have a familiarity, interest and ability to work with teens and science, engineering & technology.
- Have the ability to provide support and information to members in a way that nurtures positive self-esteem, responsibility, leadership and good decision making.
- Have adequate county, co-worker and family support to undertake the time commitment of this role.
- Have adequate county/personal resources to pay for the travel, per diem and registration costs of the meetings.
- Have permission from the district director and be a 4-H agent/volunteer in good standing.
