



Summer Camp COVID-19 Procedures & Information for Camp Volunteers

14-Day Pre-Camp Health Screen: All campers, volunteer, Extension staff, and camp staff will be required to complete a daily screening leading up to the first day of camp. This provided form includes screening questions, temperature, and symptom checks and is due on check-in day.

We suggest all guests **limit travel and contact with others** during the 14 days leading up to the first day of camp.



PPE: All guests are encouraged to bring a **minimum of 1 mask per day** to camp. Masks must be clearly marked with the name of the wearer. Clean, spare masks must be kept in a sealed and labeled plastic bag. **Remind your campers** that masks must be worn indoors at all times unless sleeping, eating, showering, and when outside when 6-ft distanced from others cannot be guaranteed. **UK "Mask Up" Guidelines:** <https://www.uky.edu/coronavirus/do-your-part/mask>



Hand Washing/Sanitizing: Soap and water hand washing stations will be available at high traffic areas around camp and in all restrooms. Hand sanitizer stations will be used as a supplementary step and provided in each cabin, activity area, and high traffic areas. **Remind your campers** to wash/sanitize their hands before and after eating, when entering and exiting buildings, and before and after using the restroom. Cabin leaders will be supplied sanitizing supplies to wipe down door knobs, light switches, bed rails, and cabin floors, twice daily. Please use the supplied gloves when completing these duties.



Daily Screening: Campers, volunteers, and Extension staff will self-screen daily and report any COVID-like symptoms to the Camp Health Care Provider. Remind your campers that if they do not feel well, it's important to let you know.

Any individual with **COVID-like symptoms** will be isolated immediately in the Health Office and may not remain at camp. Parents/Guardians must make arrangements to pick-up their minor at their earliest opportunity.



Cohorting: We are limiting our activity groups to no more than two cabins per team. Teams will travel together to and from activities with no close interaction with other teams. Physical distance and mask mandates will be in place. **Physical Distance (PD):** Camp capacity has been decreased to 50% to allow for appropriate PD in cabins, at meals, at activity areas. **Remind your campers** to maintain 6-feet PD between them and others, at all times.



Ambient Air Flow: The doors and windows of some camp facilities will remain open at all times to increase ambient air flow and ventilation.

Air Filters: All cabins and dining facilities will have MERV-13 air filters or in the air-conditioning units to ensure appropriate air filtration and comfort.

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
