Participate in a 4-H Rabbit Project!

- Learn the basic principles of raising and caring for rabbits.

- Investigate different uses of rabbits, including breeding, meat production, fur, wool, and companionship.
- Learn how to handle and show rabbits.

- Demonstrate how to properly handle a rabbit.
- Prepare a speech on how to raise and care for rabbits.

### Citizenship

- Organize and lead a rabbit activity for Cloverbuds.
- Volunteer to assist at a local rabbit show or event.

### Leadership

- Mentor a younger 4-Her on proper showmanship techniques.
- Lead a club session on the different uses of rabbits.

# Take Rabbits Further!

Here are some other opportunities to explore rabbits:

- Give a speech or demonstration related to rabbits.
- Attend a rabbit show and make note of the different breeds of rabbits and the different fur types.
- Visit a local rabbit breeder and ask about their management plan.
- Participate in a county, district, and/or state rabbit show.
- Interview a veterinarian about their educational background and job responsibilities.
- Attend a class on how to properly process and prepare rabbit meat.
- Learn how to tattoo a rabbit.
- Visit an agriculture supply store to compare costs of purchasing a pre-made cage versus purchasing materials for building a cage at home.

## Exhibit Ideas

- Create a poster showing the costs associated with purchasing, caring for, and showing a rabbit.
- Develop a video demonstrating how to properly groom a rabbit for show.

- Create a poster showing the body parts of your rabbit.
- Develop a display featuring different cuts of meat and how to properly prepare each one.
- Create a poster that includes important rabbit terminology.
